## A MESSAGE TO CHAPTER MEMBERS

A crisis can often bring out the best in people. Such was the case at our agency this past year.

In late 2009, Governor Paterson announced his Deficit Reduction Plan which called for huge reductions in the field of developmental disabilities. If enacted, Ontario ARC would have faced devastating cuts that would have significantly changed the way we provided services, or in some cases, caused us to eliminate programs altogether.

Our state agency NYSARC, Inc., along with other statewide organizations, began an all-out advocacy campaign to inform legislators as to the impact these reductions would have on people with disabilities throughout the state.

On a local level, Ontario ARC held a number of family and friends meetings to let people know what was going on and to ask their help with contacting state legislators. This was the first time in probably 30+ years that we had reached out to families this way and honestly we had no idea how people would respond.

What happened next far exceeded our expectations.

Over the course of 3 days in November, hundreds of family members met at our agency in a show of support. Parents shared stories about the impact of ARC services on the lives of their children. They expressed fear over what a loss of these services could mean in the future. Everyone that attended showed a strong commitment to do whatever it would take to get the message out to those that needed to hear it.

But there was even more.

Families said to us they wanted to be more involved in ARC. They wanted to have an opportunity to come together on a regular basis and they wanted to know ways they could help our agency. It made us wonder why we had waited so long to bring people together. It also made us appreciate what a wonderful resource our families and friends can be. The story has a happy ending, at least for the time being, as the Governor's Deficit Reduction Plan didn't happen. We know, however, with the current state of the economy we remain vulnerable to future funding cuts.

We also know that we have an ever growing network of families who strongly believe in our agency and will do whatever it takes to see that Ontario ARC continues to offer quality services for people with developmental disabilities – for that we are thankful.
