

VOCATIONAL ASSESSMENT SERVICES



Vocational Assessments are ongoing and person-centered, occurring at critical decision points throughout the vocational rehabilitation process. Specific assessment services are time-limited and meant to clarify support needs and guide the development of an Individualized Plan for Employment (IPE). It is a discovery process identifying a person's strengths, skills, interests, behavior, work readiness, and limitations as it relates to potential employment options and support services.

Assessment Options

The Arc Ontario has contracted with ACCESS-VR to provide the following assessment options:

- Career Exploration Assessment consists of a comprehensive look at a person's education, past work experience, skills, strengths, needs and career interests. Abilities identified are the basis for recommending strategies that may lead to eventual job development, job placement and job retention.
- Community Based Workplace Assessment offers career exploration in a real work setting. It is designed to better understand a person's strengths, needs, skills and experiences, and the kind of

Pre-Employment Transition Services

Pre-Employment Transition Services are pre-vocational services that address the career development needs of students with disabilities between the ages of 14-21. These services are designed to engage the student so that they develop a better understanding of themselves, their strengths, interests and abilities. This self-discovery allows students to play an active role in their transition from school to work, or to post-secondary learning options.
